

Sharing books with your child is so important & in Nursery we spend a great deal of time looking at books. Talk about what is happening in the pictures and encourage your child to guess what might happen next. Point to the words as you read them and emphasise reading from left to right.



Encourage your child to look in the mirror and describe what they can see. Ask them to draw/paint a picture of themselves and their family.

Autumn is fast approaching so enjoy being outside with your child and encourage them to look for leaves, conkers, acorns and any other natural objects.

In the cloakroom we have a sharing board. This board is for the children to share all the wonderful experiences they carry out away from school. Please feel free to put up photographs, drawings and place models on the shelf so your child can talk about the fun they have had when they are not at school.

At Low Ash Nursery we have two very special friends **Barney** and **Ben**. Each Friday throughout the year we will choose a child to take a bear home for the weekend. When they come back to Nursery they will share what they have been up to with their friends.



Extend your child's language by encouraging him/her to think e.g. *What makes you feel happy/sad/scared?* etc. 😊

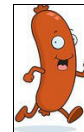
Welcome to Low Ash Nursery!

Say and use number names to 5 (or beyond if able) in familiar contexts. Recite number names in order and count objects 1-1 e.g. counting toys, chairs at a table etc.
