

This term we will be starting a weekly library session on a Wednesday. The children will have a chance to choose a book and keep it for a week. Please keep them in book bags.



Jigsaws help children to look for and recognise different colours and shapes. This is a good pre-reading skill as children have to recognise different letter shapes and words.



Colouring pictures encourages your child to hold and use pens/crayons correctly and develop control when using them as well as encouraging children to discuss the colours they are using.

Have a go at making a colour and shape book and bring it into school to show us.

Encourage your child to look for shapes and patterns in the environment when out and about. Encourage your child to name and describe the shapes. Model language such as curved, round and straight.

Play lots of turn-taking games. Board games give lots of opportunity for turn-taking.

Get involved in our core book activities by finding out about bears together, go on a colour hunt and collect various coloured items to make a colour scrapbook. Does your child know most colours? Once you've read the story together at home, find out about the other animals in the book. Where do they live? Which is their favourite animal and why?

Our theme this half term is...

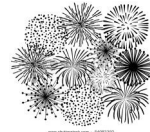
Colour and Light

There are various cultural celebrations around this time of year. Talk to your children about cultural and religious differences and how we all have different celebrations.

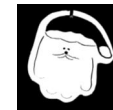
