The aim of our new curriculum is to link much of the work around a theme, which makes learning more exciting and purposeful.

### Science

In our science topic we will finish our work on animals including humans and start to investigate forces and magnets (which includes an exciting scientific workshop!) We will undertake lots of experiments ensuring we make our test a "fair" test!

### Music

In music we will continue to learn trumpets and explore rhythmic patterns using body percussion.

### English Work

This half term, alongside the grammar part of our English work, we will look at settings and character descriptions using our new topic book, Stig of the Dump. Towards the end of the half term, we will also look at some seasonal poems.
