Friday	Can you draw a chick? What colours have you used? Can you write a name label for you chick?	<b>Shape yoga</b> Can you make a square, circle, triangle, rectangle and star shape with your body? Can you make any other shapes?  Google 'shape yoga' for ideas.	Make a butterfly picture making sure the wings are symmetrical. Have a frog race – draw a picture of a small frog then cut it out. Use a large piece of paper to waft it along the floor/table. The frog that reaches the end first is the winner!	Following on from yesterday, can you show your parent/carer the life cycle of a butterfly? 1 – Curl up like an egg 2 – Crawl like a caterpillar 3 – Be as still as a chrysalis 4 – Fly like a butterfly

## Just for fun ideas

<p><b>Monday</b></p>	<p>Looking for worms. Carefully find a patch of mud that you can dig. Can you find some worms? Which is the longest? Why do we need worms?</p>
<p><b>Tuesday</b></p>	<p>Can you find a leaf outside? Look very closely at the lines on the leaf. These are called veins. Can you copy the leaf and its veins onto paper? Can you do leaf rubbings using wax crayons?</p>
<p><b>Wednesday</b></p>	<p>Seed investigation! Can you find the seeds in different fruits and vegetables? (apple, pear, cucumber, tomato, pepper, etc.) Do they all look the same? What would happen if we planted some?</p>
<p><b>Thursday</b></p>	<p>Can you make your own paintbrush? Try attaching grass, leaves, plants or flowers to a stick. Can you paint a face?</p> 
<p><b>Friday</b></p>	<p>Magic mud recipe!</p> <p>You will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Water</li> <li>• Dirt/soil</li> <li>• Baking soda</li> <li>• Powdered tempera paint, food colouring or crushed chalk</li> </ul> <p>What to do:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Mix an equal amount of soil to baking soda in a large container.</li> <li>2. Slowly add water until it gets sloppy and fun!</li> <li>3. Make pretend pies and muffins in old containers.
