Monday	English	Maths	Topic	Outside fun
Tuesday	<p>Can you make a list of all the fruit and vegetables that you know? Have a competition with someone at home. Who can write the most?</p>	<p>Make some number cards 1-10 or 1-20. Place them upside down. Turn one over, can you find that many items or can you clap your hands that many times? Repeat as many times as you like.</p>	<p>Read the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' or watch the story on YouTube. What was your favourite part and why? What didn't you like about the story and why?</p>	<p>Can you turn an egg box into your very own mini beast?</p>
Wednesday	<p>Can you draw a cherry blossom tree? What words could you use to describe the tree?</p>	<p>Number hunt. How many numbers can you find in your house. You have 40 seconds to find as many as you can. On your marks...get set...go! What was the biggest number you found? What was the smallest number you found?</p>	<p>Recap on the story of Jack and the beanstalk. How much can you remember? Can you talk about the story sequence? What happens at the beginning/middle/end? You could act out the story with your family or build your own beanstalk for example using Lego, cardboard boxes or even find a tree to climb if you live near the woods!</p>	<p>Lay on your back on the grass or a garden chair. Look up and watch the clouds moving across the sky. What shapes can you see? Can you make up a story about the clouds?</p>
Thursday	<p>Can you use your phonics to spell these mini beasts? (it doesn't have to be perfect, initial sounds will do) worm butterfly ant moth wasp grasshopper bee fly</p>	<p>Scavenger hunt! Collect 5 sticks, 5 pebbles and 5 leaves. Can you create a repeating pattern?</p>	<p>Play 'Guess who?' with the characters from the story. One person chooses a character from the story and the other person has to guess who/what they are by asking them questions.</p>	<p>Can you use things around your house and in your garden to make a kite? What things work well? What things don't? Your teacher used a plastic bag and some string to make her kite!</p>
Friday	<p>Read your favourite story. Can you retell the story to someone at home?</p>	<p>Pick an exercise/activity from the list below. Jump, hop, star jump, stand up/sit down, put on and take off your shoe. You have 30 seconds to do as many as you can! On your marks...get set...go! Which one did you do the most of in 30 seconds?</p>	<p>Draw a picture of your favourite character from Jack and the Beanstalk and write a sentence about them.</p>	<p>Track your garden snails/slugs Can you find any snails or slugs in your garden? Where do they like to live? Can you see where the slug/snail has been in your garden. Can you use their trails to see where they have been in your garden?</p>
	<p>Can you make a sign for a flower shop? Think about what you would sell in your shop and remember to make your sign really colourful.</p>	<p>Find a piece of string (or an item in your home that you can make a circle with). Can you make a circle? How many objects can you fit inside your circle. Is your circle big or small?</p>	<p>Pretend you have found your own magic beanstalk. What would you like to find at the top of it? Is there a toy shop or maybe a beach? Your teacher likes the idea of finding a jungle so she can go on an expedition to find wild animals. Design, draw or build what you would like to find at the top of your beanstalk. Maybe you could find a lion's den by covering a table with a blanket?</p>	<p>Can you create a dance about how a flower grows and moves. Think about how it starts as a seed. Then how it slowly grows into a beautiful flower. What kind of flower are you? How does the flower move in the wind/in the sun?</p>

Just for fun Ideas

Monday	Can you turn an egg box into your very own mini beast?
Tuesday	Can you learn the names of bird visitors that you can see out of the window or in the garden? Which bird visits most often? What sound does it make?
Wednesday	Can you make a paperchain caterpillar? Cut and stick strips of paper together. How long can you make your caterpillar? Can you make a repeating pattern?
Thursday	Can you make an animal puppet with legs? Draw and colour your animal and use pegs to make them stand up. You could even make a whole farm!
Friday	Can you paint with dandelions? Collect some on a walk and use the flower heads to draw on white paper. Do the green stalks leave a mark too? What other plants can you make a mark with?
