Dear Parent/Carer,

There will always be work set on Google Classroom (or sent through via School Ping for Early Years) if this does not end up being possible.

The teachers are continuing to develop their activities for remote learning on Google Classroom, with live PE lessons proving very popular with Year 5 and 6. Please continue to contact school if you have any queries about the learning provided or are having any technical issues. If you do have a missed call from Low Ash at any point, it will probably be that one of the teachers has given you a call just to see how things are going. We really want to keep in touch with all children as much as possible so that we can keep our school community together, whether your child is at home or at school.

Parent Consultation evenings would normally be taking place during the first week after half term; however, it seems sensible to postpone these until all children return to school so that teachers can talk to parents about how the children have settled back into school, how the learning is going etc.

World Book Day is fast approaching - Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> March - and we plan to celebrate this in as exciting a way as we possibly can. We would like all children (at home and at school) to dress up as their favourite book character and we know that this is always popular. Mrs Robinson will send out more details nearer the time, but we thought it would be useful to have a bit of notice about the dressing up part as this may take a little bit of time to prepare.

There will be a non-uniform day next Friday, 12<sup>th</sup> February as often happens on the last day of term. This will obviously apply for all children, whether at home or at school.

Finally, I am delighted to be able to say that Mrs Medhurst will be returning from maternity officially on Monday and we will then revert to our original roles as the co-headteachers of Low Ash. It's been quite a year!
