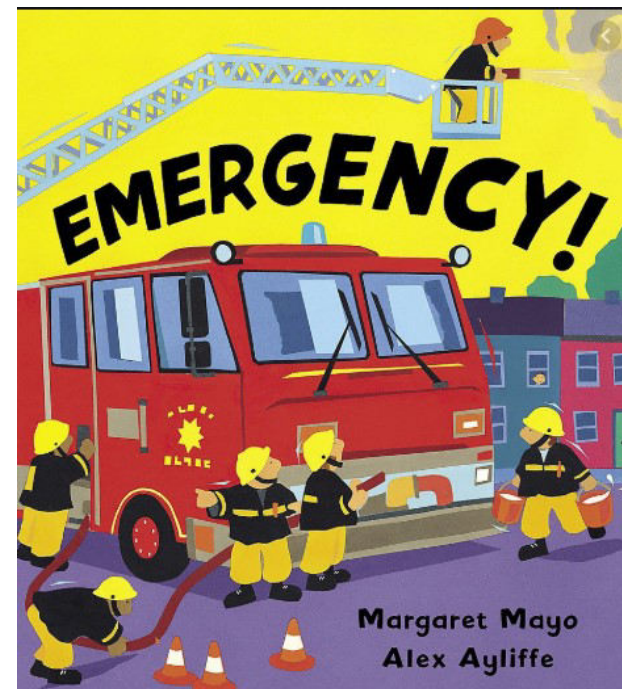


# Reception's Parental Involvement Leaflet

**People Who Help Us**

<p><b><u>Characteristics of Effective Learning</u></b></p> <p>Play games to build up children's level of concentration and sense of team work.</p>	<p><b><u>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</u></b></p> <p>Talk about how we can help others and what we need to do to be a good friend.</p>
<p><b><u>Communication and Language</u></b></p> <p>When traveling around, can your child identify the different vehicle sirens? Can you tell what that particular vehicle is used for?</p>	<p><b><u>Physical Development</u></b></p> <p>Support children in dressing and undressing.</p> <p>Develop children's gross motor skills, by way of using different apparatus, such as balls, hoops and assault courses.</p>
<p><b><u>Literacy</u></b></p> <p>Look at information books to find out all about the different jobs that people have.</p>	<p><b><u>Mathematics</u></b></p> <p>Develop children's understanding of number by recognising numbers 1-20 and saying one more or one less than any given number.</p>
<p><b><u>Understanding of the World</u></b></p> <p>Talk to your child about your job and what your child would like to do when they grow up.</p>	<p><b><u>Expressive Arts and Design</u></b></p> <p>Making vehicles using large construction and junk modelling. If you have any spare boxes, plastic tubs etc. please bring them in.</p>

Your child will have the opportunity to take the core book home to read with you and carry out an activity based on the story.
