<p>Alfred the great was a famous Anglo-Saxon ruler, who helped defend his land from the Vikings – using walls to surround the villages. One of these is still visible in Dorset, showing how well built they were.</p> <p>One of the biggest walls was 1.2km long, can you walk the distance of walking the distance AND back of the wall?</p>	<p>Anglo-Saxons were famous for their creations of jewellery out of intricate metal work. They did this to show their wealth to people in their tribes.</p> <p>Research for yourself the different types of brooches and design your own. (You could draw OR make this!)</p>	<p>Write a book review about a favourite text that you have read this half term.</p> <p>Comment on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-The Plot (Fiction) or subject (Non-Fiction)</li> <li>- Characters or key facts</li> <li>- Why you would recommend it?</li> <li>- Your favourite part</li> </ul>	<p>Can you research and do a profile on a famous Anglo-Saxon?</p> <p>Remember to show things like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Who they are?</li> <li>When were they alive?</li> <li>What did they do that was important?</li> <li>Where did they live?</li> </ul> <p>And anything else you think might be important for people to know about this person.</p>

Can you research this and try to create your own – remember to colour this in effectively with appropriate colours!</p>	<p>Research what sorts of things Anglo-Saxon people ate and drank. See if you can recreate your own or if that's not possible draw a detailed and labelled diagram of a meal they may have eaten.</p> <p>Research before is important!</p>	<p>Choose a book that you have read this term. Draw one of the main characters and write a character description. Thinking about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- appearance</li> <li>-The part he plays in the story</li> <li>- emotions at various points throughout the story</li> <li>-Why you think the author chose to include this character.</li> </ul>	<p>Can you write an information leaflet or newspaper report about a famous Anglo-Saxon event? Remember what we learned about newspapers and how they are written (use BBC Bitesize to help refresh your memory).</p>
