This role involves running the Outdoor Play and Learning provision, which allows children to enjoy a variety of play activities, build confidence, use their imagination and express themselves on the outdoor stage. We also play some music for people to sing and dance to. My role also includes supporting children across all year groups. This varies from class-based support to 1:1 and group sessions. I want all children to progress and excel in all aspects of their learning and life as a whole. Currently, I run 3 after school clubs.

Hi, my name is Beccie (Miss Taylor) and I have worked at Low Ash for 11 years. During this time, I have taken part in various roles within the school. I currently teach swimming and phonics.
