



6	2nd	Visit to Mr Hurst We will call home	After two visits to the Phase Leader  Extreme case of physical violence  Any form of discrimination	
7		Visit to Headteacher We will call home	Further Stage 5 or 6 incidents even after visiting Mr Hurst	



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
