<u>Phonics</u> – Play a game of Christmas Fred talk.


Sound out a word and see if your child can blend it together.

The children will be encouraged to represent this using their fingers and by sorting classroom objects. At home you may want to get 5 Christmas baubles and ask the children to share them into 2 groups. Encourage them to use the sentence stem:

5 is made from ___ and ___.
